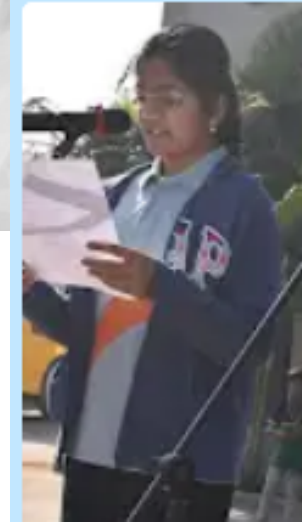

मातृ भाषा एक ऐसी भाषा है जो मनुष्य बचपन से मृत्यु तक बोलता है। घर परिवार में बोली जाने वाली भाषा ही हमारी मातृभाषा है। भाषा संप्रेषण का एक माध्यम होती है जिसके द्वारा हम अपने विचारों का आदान-प्रदान करते हैं और अपनी मन की बात किसी के समक्ष रखते हैं। जो शब्द रूप में सिर्फ अभिव्यक्त ही नहीं बल्कि भाव भी स्पष्ट करती है। एक नन्हा-सा बालक अपने मुख से वही भाषा बोलता है जो उसके घर परिवार में बड़े लोग बोलते हैं। भाषा के बिना मनुष्य जानवर के समान है जो देख तो सकता है, पर अपने अन्दर छुपी भावनाओं को कह नहीं सकता।

भारतेंदु हरिश्चंद्र ने मातृभाषा के विषय में लिखा है-

“निज भाषा उन्नति अहै, सब उन्नति को मूल,
बिन निज भाषा ज्ञान के, मिटन न हिय के सूला।”

मतलब मातृभाषा की उन्नति बिना किसी भी समाज की तरक्की संभव नहीं है। हम मातृभाषा के महत्व को इस रूप में समझ सकते हैं कि अगर हमको पालने वाली 'माँ' होती है तो हमारी भाषा भी हमारी माँ है। प्राचीन, समृद्ध और सरल भाषा होने के साथ-साथ हिंदी हमारी राष्ट्रभाषा भी है। भाषा के माध्यम से ही एक पीढ़ी अपने संचित ज्ञान को विरासत के रूप में दूसरी पीढ़ी को सौंपती है।
